NOTE :

- In accordance with MCU General Provisions for Study, all undergraduate students must pass the requirements for Service-Learning, English Proficiency, Information Technology Proficiency, Chinese Proficiency, Sports Ability, and Basic Professional Skills in order to graduate.
- Beginning with those enrolling in the academic year of 2008, students are required to take at least 12 credit hours of General Education courses. There are three disciplines within General Education – Humanities, Social Science and Natural Science. The courses are categorized into “Core Courses” and “Extended Courses” under each discipline. To meet the graduation requirements, students are required to take at least one 2-credit-hour course in each category of each of the disciplines.
- Max. Transfer elective credits which include course-related, military training, physical education are 20 units. Credit grand from teaching education cannot be counted toward the credits required for graduation. The max. counted credit hours are 12 for the general education, over that limit cannot be counted toward the credits required for graduation.
- Elective Courses for focused Course Programs: (1)At least choose from 1 inter-school crossed field focused course programs (include minor), or at least double majors. Prior to Graduation (2)students have to aggressively select and participate the relative courses from(1). However, if the students can not complete all the relative courses regarding to (1) but already fulfilly 128 units graduation requirements, they still qualified for graduation. This Course Outline may be counted toward total graduation credits by students who entered the university prior to the 2012-6 academic year.
- For international students enrolled and studying in the Department of Finance, their core and professional required courses, and general education course may be waived with courses studied at International College’s relevant courses. Besides, other courses at International College approved by Department head or Courses group head may be listed as graduation credits.
- The two-credit Business Ethics, listed in General Education, is the core course for SOM undergraduate students, who should obtain the credits in 3rd or 4th year for graduation.
- The elective courses on this Course Outline may be counted toward total graduation credits by students who entered the university prior to the 2015-8 academic year.
